




SCHOOL AIMS & VALUES

Edendork Primary School believes in promoting the spiritual, personal, social and academic goals desirable for our pupils. We wish to promote in all our pupils such values that will help them to become caring responsible citizens of the future. These Catholic values are inherent in all areas of the school's life. At Edendork, we aim:

- 1. To develop a strong Catholic ethos underpinning our pastoral care systems. This incorporates fairness, compassion, tolerance and forgiveness, whilst setting standards of respect for others and ourselves.

- 9. To present a variety of learning experiences to our pupils and staff tapping into and developing talents and interests, so that they can progress to the best of their ability.
- 10. To develop in our pupils a sense of appreciation and preservation of their environment, both at a local and global scale.
- 11. For pupils to be happy at Edendork, to do their best and to be recognised and valued for themselves.



REVIEW OF THE PAST YEAR

This review is intended to give a brief synopsis of the life and range of activities presented in Edendork P.S. during the 2019/2020 academic year. It serves as a window into the range of achievements, which have been made. A detailed listing is available in **Calendar**.

In September 2019, 37 P.1 children enrolled in Edendork P.S. thus the enrolment for 2019/2020 school year was 297.

In June 2020, 47 children transferred to second level education into the following schools:

The Curriculum

The broad and balanced curriculum presented involves the presentation of a variety of learning activities, which include opportunities to achieve in the creative areas such as sport, music, and art. In Edendork P.S, the teaching and expression of our Catholic faith and values, are very important elements of our curriculum and permeates every aspect of our school life. A team approach is key in all our plans and evaluations for curriculum development. The role of pupils, parents, all staff and governors continues to be paramount in this process. A whole school audit of all stakeholders was undertaken in May 2017. This has identified our strengths informed areas for future whole school improvement/development (School Development Plan 2017 – 2020).

Despite restrictions imposed by the Covid 19 pandemic during the 2019/2020 school year, teachers at Edendork continued to be involved in raising standards in the three key areas of Numeracy, ICT and Literacy. In term one, teachers and classroom assistants were presented with training and resources in Thinking Skills and Personal Capabilities. Strategies to promote the independent learner, resilience, flexibility and thinking frames were explored. Fortunately, the use of digital media such as Class Dojo to enhance teachers' communication with parents had been introduced into classroom practice during the 2018/2019 academic year. As planned this was further developed in 2019/2020 with the enhancement of children's learning through the introduction of digital programmes including Lexia (P.1 - P.3), Purple Mash (P.3 - P.7) and Mini Mash (P.1 & P.2). Through a review of need during lockdown, Mathletics was subsequently purchased and reintroduced throughout the school. Teachers', children and parents' skills and knowledge of these ICT platforms/programmes as a medium of communicating and enhancing pupil learning, were significantly enhanced as Remote Learning came into practice from March 2021.



Prior to March 2020, all staff were presented with Child protection training. Teachers and classroom assistants were presented with information in relation to Anti Bullying legislation and teachers were also presented with information in relation to the new SEND legislation. **Use of School Development Days**

Special Educational Needs

All teaching staff continued to ensure data and information derived from assessment (including adult observations), fed into targets set and future teaching for learning. Pupil progress was regularly reviewed. Where there was cause for concern, parents were contacted or parents contacted the school and children were placed on the 'Special Educational Needs Register' according to the current Code of Practice for special educational needs. No child was registered on Edendork P.S. Special Needs Register without parental permission. Individual Education Plans were written for pupils who were on Stage 2



and above on the Code of Practice. These were reviewed termly with the parents/carers. Advice was sought from external agencies, such as RISE NI; Occupational Therapists, EA Educational Psychologist, the Autism Team, Visual Impaired Team and Behavioural Support Team, where and when required.

Prior to lockdown on 23rd March, the EA also provided peripatetic support to individual children and classroom/general assistants to assist the school in facilitating individual need. Trained classroom assistants continued to present small groups of children, from all key stages, with a programme of activities delivering Sensory Motor skills. In addition to this, one retired teacher voluntarily presented the Solais Programme to children.

Throughout the 2019/2020 school year, the special educational needs provided in Edendork P.S. was monitored and evaluated by Mrs S. Shields (SENCO). Edendork P.S. Special Educational Needs Policy is available on the school website or alternatively a copy can be requested.

Assessment and Reporting

Prior to 23rd March 2020, children were observed by their teacher and/or classroom assistant to generate individual attainment and plan learning experiences which were appropriate to individual development. Each year group also utilised a range of commercial and non-commercial produced class tests which were subsequently utilised by the teacher to inform planning for future learning and teaching. Every child's progress - academic, social, and physical - was continuously assessed and reviewed, with parents being kept informed both formally and informally of their child's progress. Examples of this occurring informally included comments related to homework, class tests, parent contacting the school to arrange a meeting with the teacher (prior to lockdown)/message the class teacher at any time during the school year through Class Dojo and vice-versa. All parent teacher interviews occurred in December 2018.

At a significant expense to the school, in terms of finance, the school purchased commercially produced tests which was intended to generate a '360 student profile' for each pupil. In the first and second terms commercially produced tests administered included P.2 MIST Test, P.4 and P.6 CAT tests, Group Reading Tests and Group Spelling Tests for children from P.3 – P.7. Due to Covid 19 restrictions, which resulted in a lockdown and remote learning from 23rd March to 30th June, commercially produced tests were not administered from this date.

In 2019/2020, due to the Covid 19 Pandemic, end of key stage assessment did not take place in Northern Ireland.

All teachers created and disseminated to parents via Class Dojo individual electronically generated reports for each child at the end of the school year. These reports were focused on reporting children's achievements and attainment in the areas of:

Communication - Using Mathematics - Using ICT - Religious education
 Interests and Strengths including achievements and highlights were also reported for each child.



After Schools and Extra Curricular Activities

In 2019/2020, Edendork P.S. was very fortunate to have received £17,605 from DENI for Extended Schools activities. All resources funded via DENI Extended Schools were utilised to enhance children's and key adults' experiences out of school hours. This included subscriptions for children to access online learning including Purple Mash/Mini Mash, Lexia Reading and Accelerated Reader. The funding was also utilised to present Keep Fit classes, after school coding classes, Traditional Music, Ready to Learn Club, Mini Me Yoga and partially funded the Breakfast Club. KNex resources were also purchased and an ETPAK Engineering & Technology workhop was presented to parents/grandparents and children. In addition to this, Edendork P.S. "clustered" with other schools in the locality, namely St. Patrick's College, Newmills P.S. and Integrated College Dungannon in presenting the children with STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Mathematics) after schools. The design and making of Christmas Wreaths and the wooden flower container with a mosaic of the school crest which is located at the front of the school, are examples of the activities the children were engaged in.

In addition to the DENI Extended Schools activities, children from P.1 and P.3 availed of the After School Club organised by classroom assistants from 2:00 p.m. – 3:00 p.m. A French teacher offered French lessons to children from P.3 to P.7 once a week and an external coach presented tennis lessons. These activities were funded by parents of participants. In addition to this, teachers/classroom assistants presented after school Maths, Literacy and Gaelic Football.

Mid Ulster District Council continued to subsidise Traditional Music lessons to small groups of children in P.4, P.5 and P.6 which included tin whistle and guitar. The services of a local musician/tutor were utilised enabling all P.4, P.5 and P.6 children the opportunity to avail of tin whistle lessons. The EA Music Service provided tuition to Key Stage 2 children. In the first term, we availed of Tyrone County Board Gaelic sports coaches for football, camogie and hurling. Prior to Lockdown, P.7 girls and boys had participated in Camogie, Hurling and Indoor Football tournaments. Children from both P.5 classes and one P.7 class availed of swimming lessons in Dungannon Leisure Centre. Fitness Freddy presented a 'Mental Health and Well Being Day' to P.6 & P.7 pupils. Tyrone County Board provided the school with a camogie/hurling coach once a week and the DENI Sports Programme was presented to all Key Stage 2 classes. In the second term, the University of Ulster were presenting 'Sport for Life' coaching to P.5 pupils while St. Mary's College were presenting a Coaching Programme to children from P.1 to P.3/P.4. Both these programmes came to an abrupt ending with lockdown.

Children from P.4 and P.5 classes were presented with Mandarin Chinese Language lessons. In the second term, P.7 children availed of Irish lessons presented by a University of Ulster student.

Following the elections in the second week of December (which coincided with the General Elections) Edendork Primary School Council engaged in activities for school improvement



including organising a Non uniform Pyjama/Lazy Day. Funds raised enabled the School Councillors to purchase two rabbits for children in the school to look after and to be kind and caring towards. The Eco Club planted daffodil bulbs in the chapel grounds and continued to engage the whole school community in various activities throughout the year including recycling of paper and cards, promoting the correct use of the brown bin and energy efficiency. In December 2019 Mid Ulster District Council awarded the £1000 Festive Grant to the local Eden group. A Christmas tree and lights purchased through this funding was sited on the school grounds. The impact of this over the festive season was much appreciated by the Edendork community and beyond.

The local Church and school continued to work closely together with the school chaplain Fr. Milan being a regular visitor to the school prior to Lockdown. Children were presented with the opportunity to attend Mass to mark school and Church occasions. A number of classes were presented with the opportunity to lead Key Stage assemblies. Parents and family friends were invited to attend. Unfortunately, due to the Covid 19 pandemic, despite preparations being made neither P.4 nor P.7 received the respective sacraments during the 2019/2020 school year.

We continue to build on our partnership with the post primary schools in the area. We were also extremely fortunate to continue to avail of a very strong community link with St. Joseph's Donaghmore who provided Reading Partners for individual pupils in P.2 and P.3. St. Patrick's College students also further developed their link by students proving classroom assistant support in P.2 to P.4 classes one hour a week for the first term.

Edendork P.S. continued to enjoy the loyal support and tireless work of a number of parents who form the Parent Support Group. These parents give their valuable time and effort to help provide our pupils with equipment and experiences not funded by the Department of Education. The Parents Support Group (PSG), hosted various after school activities throughout the year including a Halloween Fancy Dress Disco, presented Advent Calendars at Christmas and making of St. Brigid's crosses. Many of these events, which occurred after school hours, were enjoyed by young and old.

School Building & Resources

In February 2020, an application was made from DENI to MUDC (Mid Ulster District Council) for full planning permission for a new 11 classroom build at Edendork P.S. This will be located on the current site of St. Malachy's Parochial Hall. Proposed plans have been shared at public consultation and are available for viewing on entry to the school.

During lockdown from March to June, one classroom in the main school building was painted and three mobile classrooms were also painted.



'Fund Raising'

During the 2019/2020 academic school year, parents, pupils and teachers of Edendork P.S. were involved in various fund raising events to boost school funds and consequently, resources. The Edendork P.S. '300 Club' was launched. With prizes of £1700 being sponsored by Cara Pharmacy, this initiative raised £14,160 for school funds by June 2020. The availability of this funding enabled the school to plan to put measures and resources in place for the full return of children to school in September 2020. A Sponsored Silence activity in September raised £1,555 towards school funds and a Non Uniform Fancy Dress Day raised £200. 68 shoeboxes were presented on behalf of the school for the Blythswood Appeal. St Vincent De Paul received a significant donation of foods from the school for the P.7 Christmas Hampers. A Dress up in Character Day raised £243. A Christmas Jumper Day raised £174 and Christmas Hamper Raffles (with prizes donated by staff) raised £730 for school funds. A School Ceili and Non Uniform Green Day to mark St. Patrick's Day accumulated to £212. Funding acquired was utilised to subsidise travel to indoor tournaments in the first term; rewards including activities presented during National Book Week. The painting of classrooms and the paint for the exterior of mobiles was also purchased from school funds. These funds were also used for a special farewell to our P.7 children which included a drone videoing their parade from St. Malachy's GAA grounds to the school which was then followed by Mc Donalds'.

P.7 children also undertook the Junior Enterprise Programme which presented them with the opportunity to create a business. As we had two P.7 classes, each class competed with each other to create the most successful business. 'Snow Globes' and 'School Calendars' were designed, manufactured and sold at a profit.

The accumulated efforts of the PSG provided the school with the ability to purchase laptops and printers to the value of £2,340. In addition to this, the PSG presented every child in the school with an advent calendar in December.

Security

Edendork P.S. has only one main entrance / exit during the school day, i.e. via the front door. While we value our role in the community, we must be aware at all times that the safety of the children is paramount. There should be no member of the general public or unidentified personnel on the school grounds or in the school building during the school day. All staff and volunteers accessing the pupils during the school day have been vetted according to EA Access NI, this includes members of our Parents Support Group. From September 2019 to March 2021, all visitors to the school, during the school day, were requested to inform the secretary of their arrival and sign the 'Visitors Book'. Parents are requested not to go directly to their child's class but to report to the office. An unfamiliar adult in the school ground can potentially be upsetting to children. If a parent wished to speak to a teacher or the Principal, an appointment was made by telephone / through a written note / message on Class Dojo.



Provision during Covid 19 March to June Lockdown

Following concerns about the health and safety of children and staff, the governors via the Chairman, closed Edendork P.S. to children on 18th March, 19th March and 20th March. Two holidays (Friday 10th April & Friday 17th April) were brought forward and a staff training day (Thursday 9th April) to facilitate this.

From Monday 23rd March, following a directive received from the Minister of Education after 7p.m. on Friday 20th March, Edendork P.S. opened for "vulnerable children and children of key workers". Parents of 24 children who were enrolled in Edendork P.S. registered as to possibly requiring the 'learning supervision' service. This service was operated throughout the lockdown with 5-7 non-teaching and 6 teaching staff being available throughout. Rotas for teachers supervising therefore commenced at 12 noon so they could set up the learning for the day for the children and address any initial queries.

Following DENI guidelines, all teachers worked remotely at home providing distance learning through Class Dojo. Communication with parents and children occurred daily including the setting of tasks, videos presented, comments and written feedback given. Throughout the school, online programmes including Lexia, Accelerated Reader and Purple Mash were used to enhance children's digital learning in key curriculum areas. Mathletics was also purchased and implemented throughout the school in term 3. Class packs of workbooks and photocopied resources were also prepared by the teachers and presented periodically to parents of children throughout.

Finance

Since April 1991 the school has been responsible for the management of its overall budget. To this end the Board of Governors has overall responsibility, although on a day-to-day basis this responsibility is delegated to the Principal.

In the current financial climate, last year saw the tightening of the spending belt even further thus, prudent management was the order of the day. The school's allocation for the financial year 2019/2020 was £825,455 This figure covers the cost of staffing and general running costs. Overleaf is a copy of the Outturn Statement prepared by the school (in the absence to date of one not being available from the Education Authority- LMS Southern Section). This statement details the overall budget allocation, its breakdown and the balance that remained at the end of the financial year. To ensure a wide range of resources are enjoyed by all pupils throughout Edendork P.S., fundraising and accessing funding from external sources has been vital.

Shared Education:

"Learning and working together to build a community based on shared values and respect." (Shared Education Vision created by staff and governors from Edendork P.S.and staff from Howard Memorial P.S. August 2017)

In September 2019 Edendork P.S. embarked on the fourth year of the Shared Education Signature Project took with our counterparts from the Howard Memorial P.S. in the first term, children teachers and classroom assistants from the Howard Memorial worked for 8 lessons in Play with Mrs Bowe's P.2 class; 8 lessons related to Numicon with Mrs Litter and Mrs Quinn's P.3 class and two lessons creating a short musical production with Mrs Mc Ateer P.5 class. This was showcased to parents in the Howard P.S. in December. In the second term, both P.6 classes and Mrs Lowe's P.3/P.4 class participated in Shared Education with their counterparts from the Howard. P.6 children explored STEM based activities while Mrs Lowe's class were involved in PDMU and art activities. It was planned that all twelve classes would be involved in Shared Education in the 2019/2020 school year however, the remainder of the planned programme was cancelled due to the Covid 19 pandemic. This included planned continuous professional development opportunities for staff.

Sporting, Extra Curricular Achievements and Presentations

The 2019/20 academic school year, commenced with a range of sporting afterschool activities including Gaelic Football, Tennis and Keep Fit. Tyrone County Board presented camogie/hurling and football coaching. In the second term, Fitness Freddy presented a 'Mental Health and Well Being Day' to P.6 & P.7 pupils, the DENI Sports Programme was presented to all Key Stage 2 classes; the University of Ulster also presented 'Sport for Life' coaching to P.5 pupils.

Sporting events attended included girls and boys indoor Gaelic football, indoor soccer, Camogie and Hurling tournaments which were hosted in Clonoe, Lough View Centre and St Patrick's Academy. We experienced some measure of success when Edendork P.S. won the St. Joseph's Handball Tournament hosted in St. Joseph's Coalisland. All P.7 children competed in Mid Ulster Cross Country Running with one child achieving first place in the local Dungannon heat and consequently progressed to the Mid Ulster Council finals..

Throughout 2019/2020, children at Edendork P.S. engaged in regular P. E. lessons. With the introduction of remote learning in March, this included virtual lessons as presented by Joe Wicks, skills videos presented by Tyrone County Board Coach and Mr. Morgan via the local football club. All children were encouraged to participate in virtual sports which concluded with a special Sports Day in June hosted via Healthy Kidz.

In the second term, children represented the school in a Road Safety Table Quiz and children also participated in the local Credit Union Quiz which was hosted in St. Joseph's Coalisland. One team was awarded third place at this event with one team achieving first place. The latter team progressed to the regional heat in Armagh City Hotel where they



achieved fifth place. We also hosted the local heat of the Tyrone Cumann na mBunscol here in Edendork to which several other schools attended.

Prior to 23rd March, four children from each classroom were presented with monthly golden certificate awards for effort in class work, home work, behaviour and contribution to school life. Children from each Key Stage received weekly Best Boy and Best Girl certificates. These were awarded at assembly to children who displayed courtesy and a positive attitude to school life.

As part of National Book Week Prizes were awarded to P.1 – P.3 children for efforts in the Reading Challenge and P.4 to P.7 children for individual effort in the Accelerated Reader Programme. This included £50 in vouchers from Begleys Sports and a signed Tyrone jersey.

Children achieved awards in a range of activities participated in outside school. These included Speech and Drama, Summer Reading Challenge, Dance, Football, Judo, writing competitions, singing, playing different instruments and art. These achievements were celebrated at School Assembly and displayed centrally within the main build.

During Remote Learning, children's achievements continued to be celebrated publicly through Class Dojo and/or the school Facebook page. This included musical achievements with one child performing on the piano which was broadcasted on Cool FM 'Cool At Bedtime'. Photographs and videos created of children engaging in a wide range of activities were also showcased with special videos created of P.1 children, first Communicants and P.7 leavers.. Children were also rewarded for their efforts academically by receiving virtual certificates for achievements eg. Accelerated Reader Millionaire/Multimillionaire; Mathletics Bronze, Silver and Gold Awards. Individual achievements including identified good practice put in place by teachers eg 'Show and Tell Fridays' was shared and implemented by teachers.




